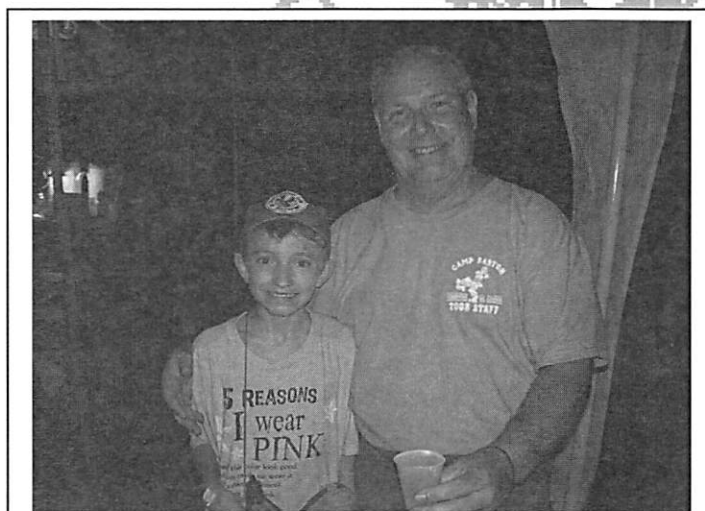
Camp Director

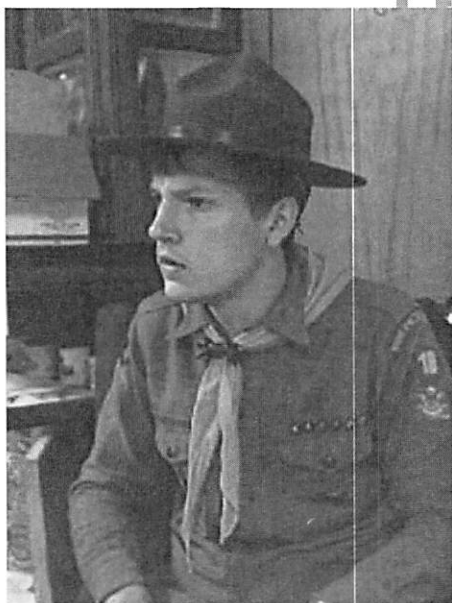

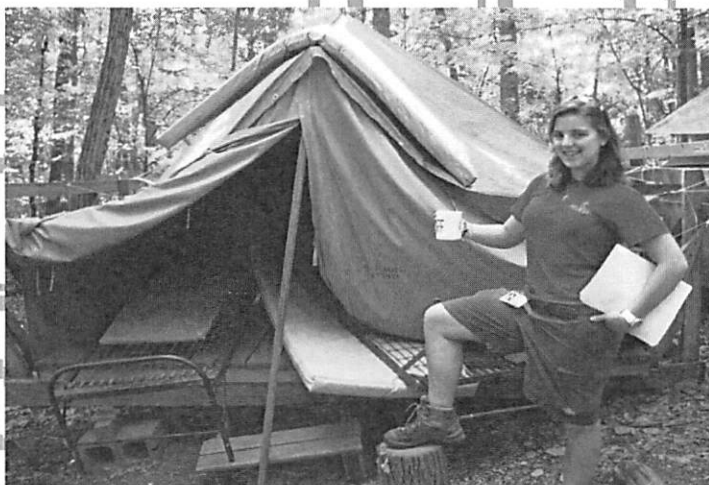

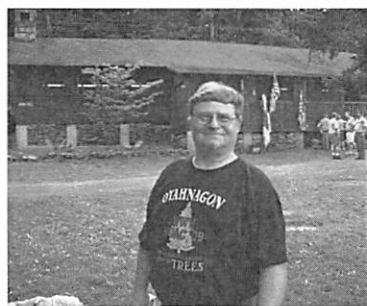
commissioners

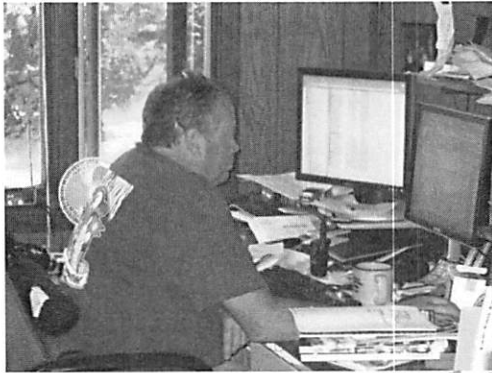

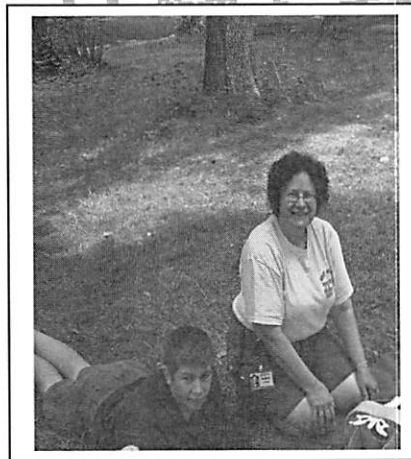

With their raccoon-emblazoned flag flying proudly and their identities hidden by black masks, the Bandits crept slowly through the jungle under the cover of darkness.

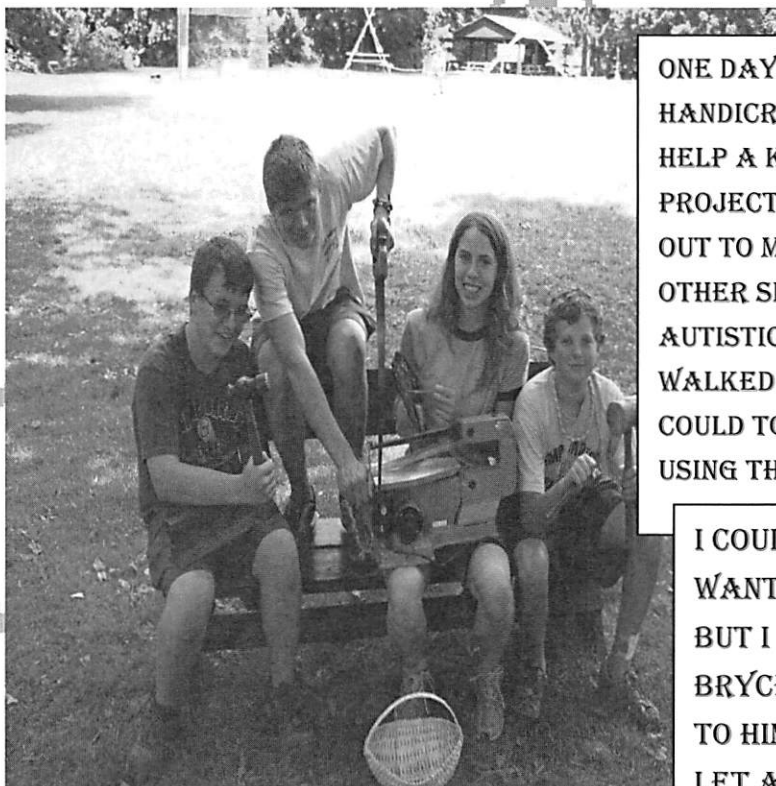
