CAMP DIRECTOR

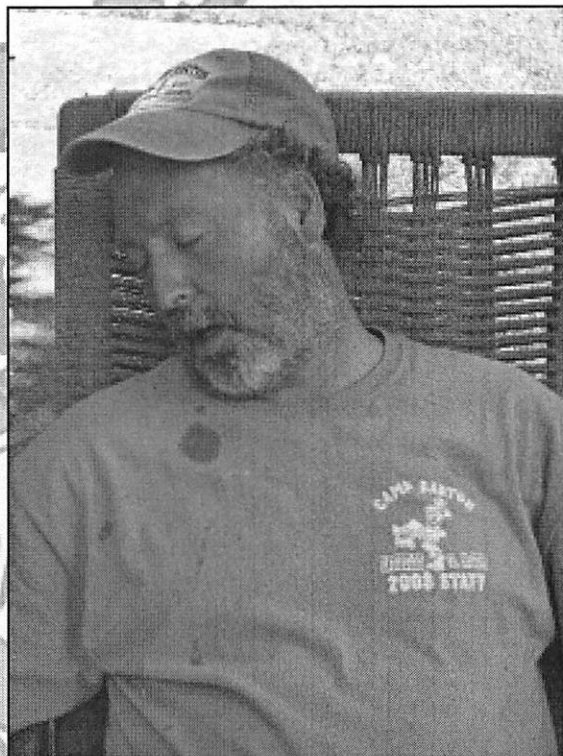
Camp Director:

PROGRAM DIRECTOR

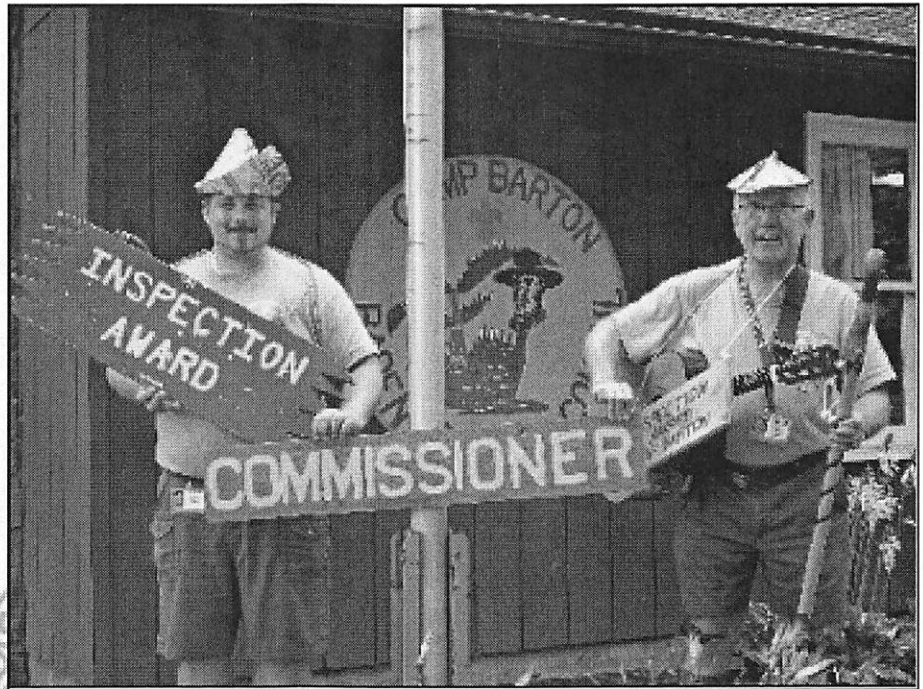
From Jeff Andrews, the Program Director:

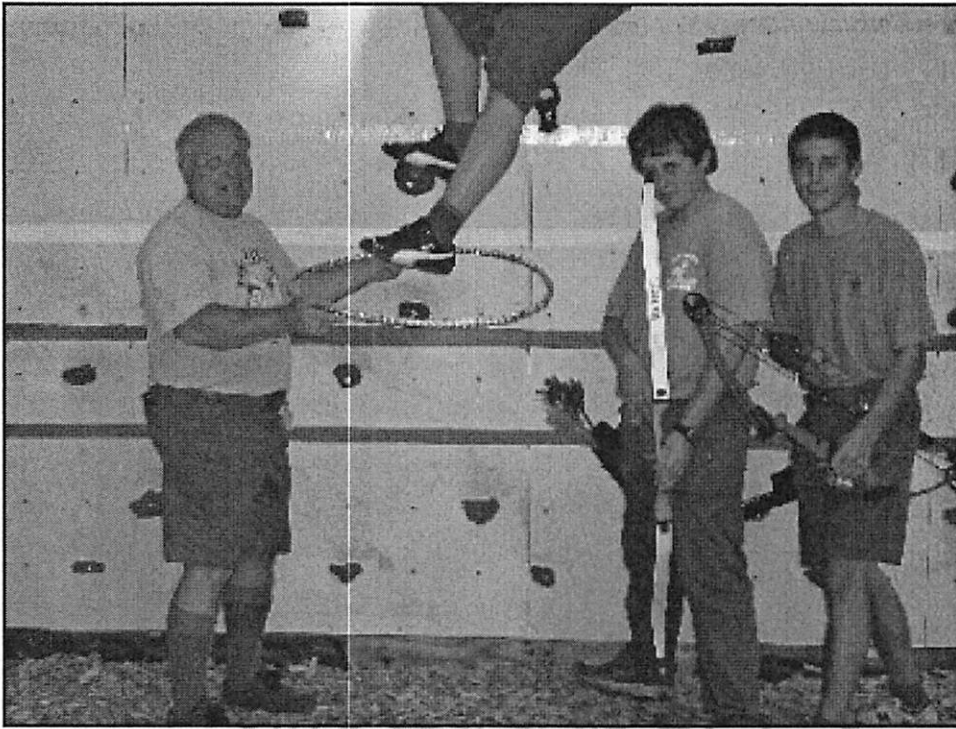

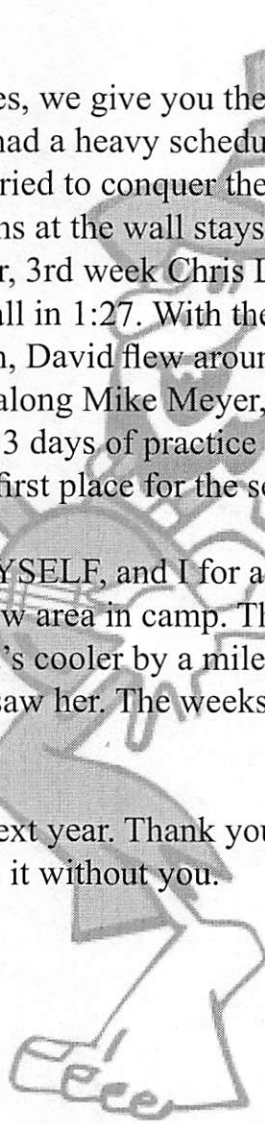
From the Climbing Director

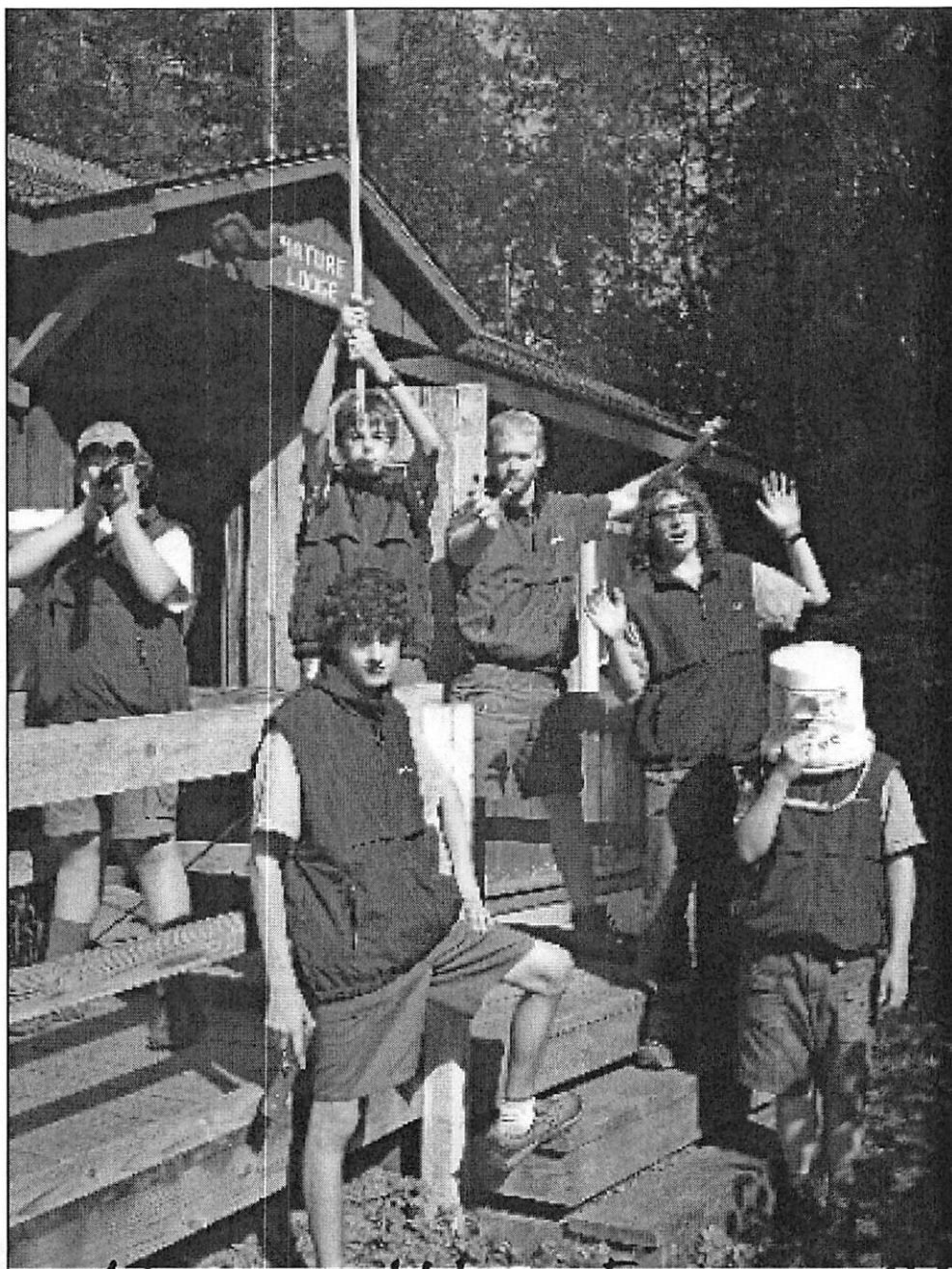

I look forward to working with you all next year. Thank you for your friendship and humor this summer. We couldn't have done it without you.

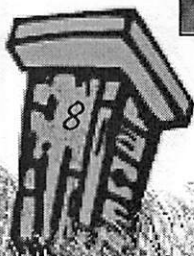

HANDICRAFT



Here chronicles the zenith of the ancient empire known to modern-day archeologists as Handicraft. The primitive tools, their perpetual state of poor quality, and the shoddy crafts unable to withstand the test of time casts a shadow of mystery over the ancient empire. Hence, historians gave the ancient empire its moniker. The name Handicraft derives from two words - Han and Dicraft. Their meanings remain a mystery, just like the empire.

The Golden Age of Handicraft has been sectioned into three distinct eras - the Basket Weaver, the Metalworker/Pointy Stick Carver, and the World Traveller. The Basket Weaver featured at a time marked with constant Civil War, baskets, and underwater baskets. It has been a pleasure to be a Camp Barton staffer for 18 years and I hope, God willing, that I will be able to continue in the future.

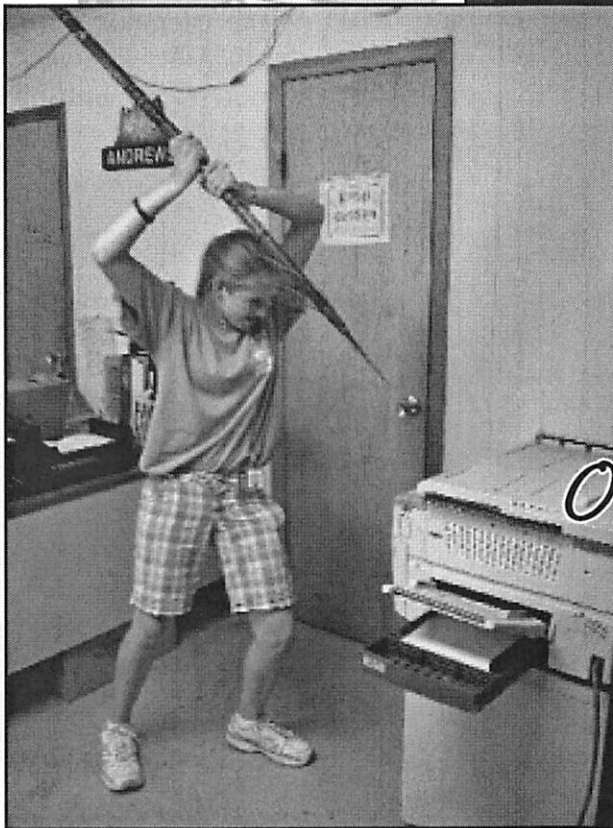
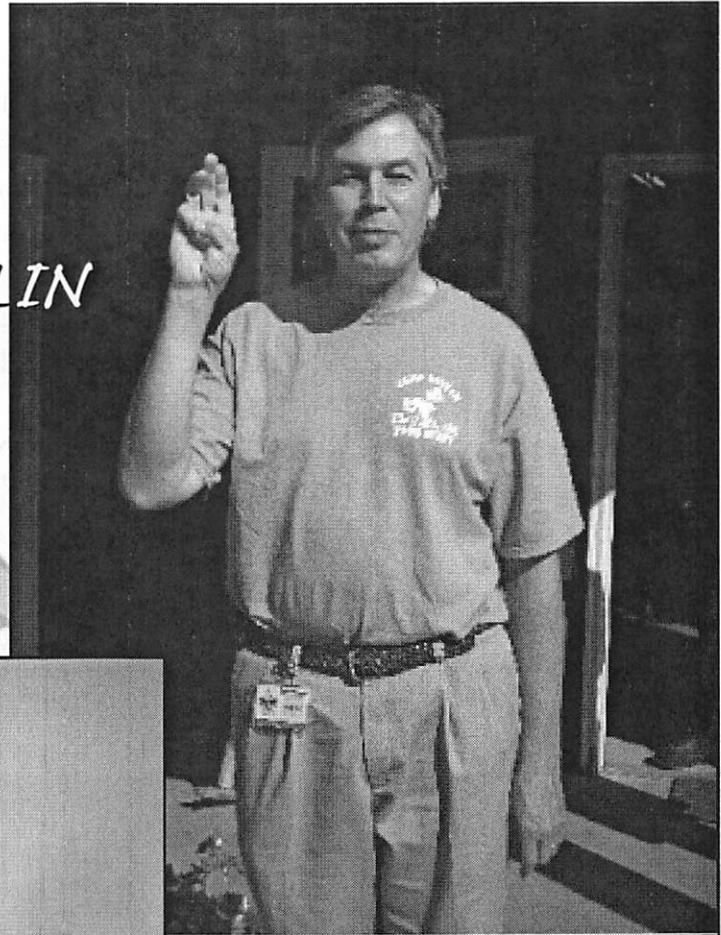

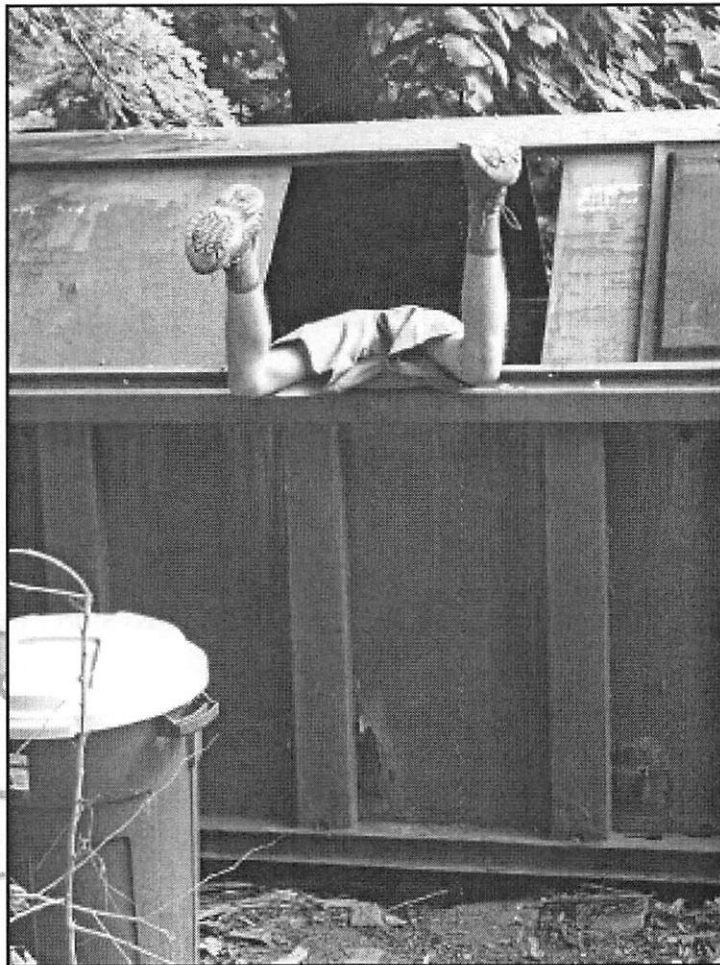
KITCHEN AND DINING HALL
