







So thanks for all of your support, long hours, and arduous labor, but most especially for your scouting spirit, which is alive and well at Camp Barton.



The Band





Outdoor Skills


Scoutcraft and Sidney Winter


The Queen of Scoutcraft

- "Absolutely!"






Nature






Shooting Sports






Handicraft




Services

Chaplain



There was standing room only with all twenty eight benches filled. We followed the theme of "Respect - A Scout is Reverent," the twelfth point of the Scout Law. The World Friendship Fund offerings averaged from \$60.00 to \$125.00 each week. The Barton "B" Chaplain's Aid segment training was conducted at least four times during the week - with a lot of interest shown from the out of council troops who have not been to Camp Barton before. This is the fifth year for this segment. The Chaplain spent time with homesick campers and others who just wanted to discuss issues on their minds. Also the Chaplain provided Youth Protection Training to approximately 150 scouts. It was a very busy and enjoyable summer

The Health Lodge as always was a hub of activity from dispensing medications, treating injuries and illness, to teaching two First Aid merit badge classes. 
Dining Hall


Editors Note
