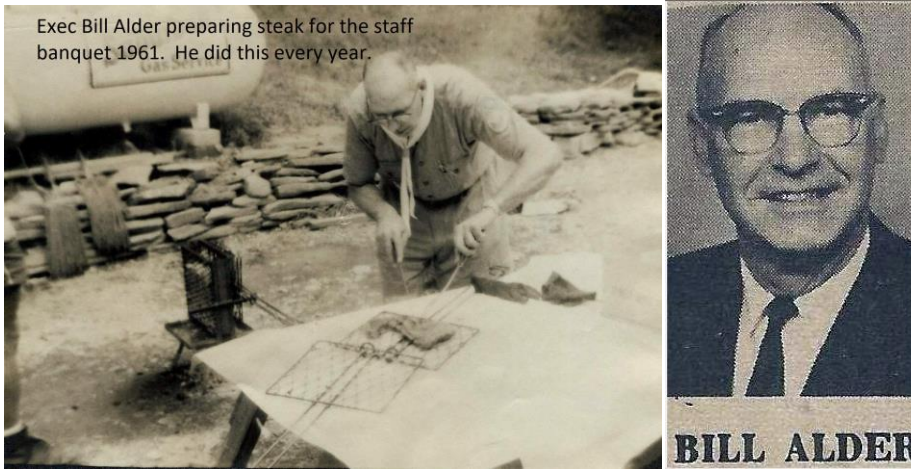

19 Barton Memories – Sunday Check In at Camp

Check in day. Sunday afternoon would find the arrival of Scout Executive Bill Alder arriving confident that the usual 190 Scouts would be well taken care of by the Barton staff. Bill would place his lounge chair on the North point and enjoy the sunshine. This is Bill preparing for the staff banquet at the end of a successful season. 1946 Camp Director



One remembrance of Bill is Pioneer Week – the week before staff week, Alan, Tom and others would be at camp working on Bill's preparation list. We ate well having shopped in T'burg on Bill's account. We even made neckerchiefs from old mattress covers. One quirk, Bill had us loading the truck with river rock to help get the truck up the hill – and drop the rock off at Bill's home. Bill had a plan. These were the 60's.



This view of Sunday check in shows Ed Ostrowsky, DE, Camp Director Alan Dixon, an unidentified Mom, and Leaders of Troop 81 and later Troop 79 Jim Bugh and Frank Vansickle. Troop 79 from Homer, NY was DJ's (CBSAA Secretary) troop in the early 90's.

As troops arrived and gathered they were assigned a staff guide and taken to a campsite; followed by changing to swim wear. Off to the health lodge ! And the dining hall for an orientation. And then to the waterfront for a swim check and issuing of buddy tags. Usually in week 1, Cayuga Lake might be in the 50's. Screaming heard.



BSA Swimmer Test Requirements:

All youth participants are designated as swimmers, beginners, or nonswimmers based on swimming ability confirmed by standardized BSA swim classification tests. Each group is assigned a specific swimming area with depths consistent with those abilities. The classification tests should be renewed annually, preferably at the beginning of the season.

Swimmers pass this test:

Jump feet first into water over the head in depth. Level off and swim 75 yards in a strong manner using one or more of the following strokes: sidestroke, breaststroke, trudgen, or crawl; then swim 25 yards using an easy resting backstroke. The 100 yards must be completed in one swim without stops and must include at least one sharp turn. After completing the swim, rest by floating.

Beginners pass this test:

Jump feet first into water over the head in depth, level off, and swim 25 feet on the surface. Stop, turn sharply, resume swimming and return to the starting place. Anyone who has not completed either the beginner or swimmer tests is classified as a non-swimmer.

The non-swimmer area should be no more than waist to chest deep.

Barton welcomed Tenderfoot Scouts any Sunday. This Scout was 11 years old in 1956, his first year at camp.



Alan's Scoutmaster, Troop 39, Clarence Krom from Ludlowville, NY was a plumber and taught me a lot about this practical activity. We would go to the annual Scout-O-rama in Barton Hall at Cornell and solder copper pipe. He got me to finish up my Eagle badge, and got me my first job at the place known as Camp Barton. What chu want, these are titled "Barton Memories". DJ asked for them. But I digress.

This was a pivotal part of the Retreat Ceremony as was the Bugle playing To the Color.

The retreat ceremony at 5pm began with Scouts lining up with the Drum and Bugle Corps and marching to the parade field. Everyone lined up and at attention and the cannon went boom, the echo heard from the other side of the lake and the flag was lowered and presented to the Camp Director. Ideally all marched to the dining hall for dinner. If not, there was a run to the dining hall.



Basic camp rules were delivered after the Sunday meal.

Sometimes a revered Scouter would be introduced and asked for a few words. This is J Lawrence Smith, famous for amusing puns. He was a diligent worker at the Reconstruction Home in Ithaca – originally as a home for kids with Polio.

January 5, 2024 JL Smith 108 years in Scouting – remembered for his service.

One item in the Sunday orientation covered Emergencies. If someone was lost or decapitated the Emergency Bell would be rung that could be heard in Trumansburg. Lucky – it was seldom used. But if you heard it you were to return to your campsite ASAP for an attendance check. One time a missing Scout was reported at night; I had the staff form a line and sweep West up the hill. At least one staff member remembers discovering the PRICKER bushes on the way West. The missing Scout was a false alarm, that's the story and we're sticking with it.



Bells have a centuries-long tradition of varied use in the navies and merchant fleets of the world. Signaling, keeping time, and sounding alarms are important in a ship's routine and readiness. Their functional and ceremonial uses have made them a symbol of considerable significance to the United States Navy.



A feature of Sunday night was the camp fire on North Point – I remember 200 people at these. Opening song, Skits, more singing and a camp fire story. The Golden Arm ?

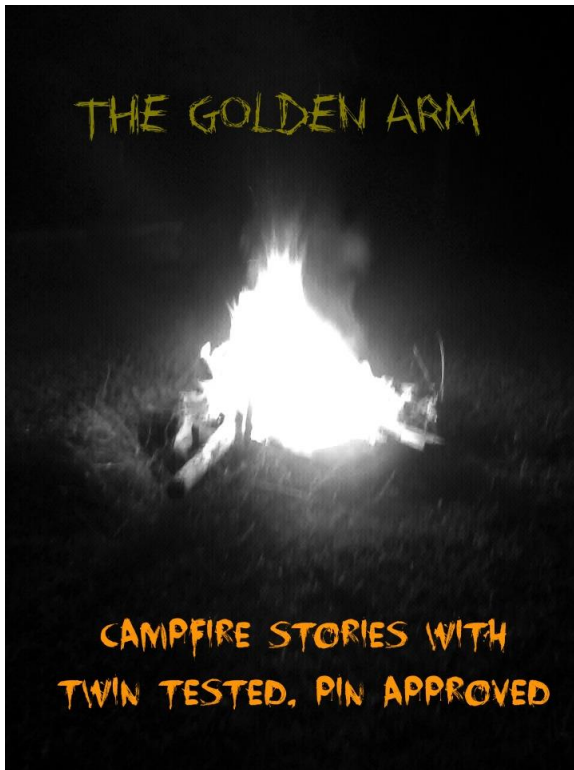


The Golden Arm
